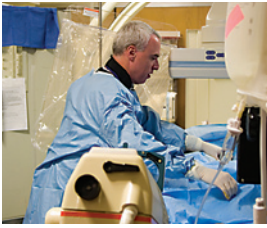

Offering an interactive forum, the conference on **Emergent Management of Neurovascular Events** will cover issues that have an impact on emergency care, including endovascular management of emergent neurological conditions, sub-arachnoid hemorrhages, non-subarachnoid intracranial hemorrhages, life threatening epistaxis, carotid blowout syndrome, and medicolegal aspects of the ER management of

actual and potential intracranial hemorrhage and ischemic stroke.
